Having experienced the depth and challenge provided by the BGE in S3 pupils choose the 6 subjects they wish to study in the Senior Phase (2 being English/Maths).

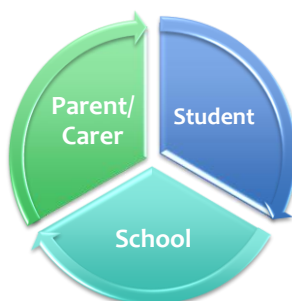
