The Career Ready programme gets you ready for the world of work through one-to-one mentoring, paid internships, skills masterclasses, and workplace visits. All provided by our network of employers including some of the largest companies in the UK.

Whether you want to go into work, study at university, apply for an apprenticeship, or are unsure about your next steps – the Career Ready programme can help you.

Our year 1 Career Ready students have now all been given paid internship placements for 4 weeks of the summer holidays. Students have met all their mentors and fellow students on the program at the launch event that took place in Winchburugh Academy.

Our students welcomed this year's mentors in for a visit to the school and for a mentor catch up session after the Christmas holidays. This was a great opportunity to reconnect and show the mentors what school life is like at ICHS.

In the upcoming months Year 1 pupils will be attending numerous workshops to equip them with skills needed for life, learning and work which will help to prepare them for their summer internships.

Modern vs Graduate Apprenticeship

A Modern Apprentice is employed and works towards a qualification with a college or learning provider.

A Graduate Apprentice is employed and works full-time while gaining an Honours or Masters degree on a day release.

So, the main difference between a Modern Apprenticeship and a Graduate Apprenticeship is the level of qualification you achieve. A Modern Apprenticeship will typically lead to an SVQ or HNC qualification, while a Graduate Apprenticeship will lead to an Honours or Masters degree.



Woodland Trust Initiative and MiniCop 2024

ICHS has partnered with the Woodland Trust on three impactful initiatives so far this session: exploring forestry careers, hosting a MiniCop event focused on environmental sustainability, and most reently participating in a tree planting program as part of the regeneration of Ladywell Woods. These experiences aimed to inspire students into these careers, foster environmental awareness, and contribute to local conservation efforts.

Students planted 154 native trees, including elder, oak, holly, and rowan, contributing directly to the revitalization of Ladywell Woods. This experience fostered a sense of community responsibility and ownership towards the local environment.

We are in the planning stages for MiniCop 2024. after a successful one in 2023. The aim of thiRaise awareness about environmental issues like sustainability, litter, and forest fires within the school and broader community, aiming to increase engagement with local community and organisations.
