Update to dining hall procedures

QR Payment:- Our dining hall recently introduced the use of QR codes for payment. This is an alternative to the payment card which pupils currently used. Staff are sharing a unique QR code with pupils which can be put onto their phone. This links to their existing account and allows them to pay for food. This secure method of payment is significantly increasing the speed of service at tills.

Queuing System:- From Monday 9th June, all pre orders will be collected from the separate servery on the right of our dining hall. All queues at the main servery will be QR, card and debit card payment. This will improve the efficiency of our queues.

University of Dundee - Mini Open Day!

From 10:00 - 12:00, academics from a range of disciplines will be delivering interactive taster lectures and activities designed to inspire students and give them a real sense of what it is like to study these subjects at university. Taster Lectures include:

- Business
- Centre for Anatomy and Human Identification (CAHID)
- Computing
- Duncan of Jordanstone College of Design and Art (DJCAD)
- Engineering
- Languages

Here's a sneak peek at some of the sessions our academics will be running:

Centre for Anatomy and Human Identification (CAHID) – Ever wondered how our bodies work and what's going on inside them? In this session students will be introduced to the anatomy of the human body. They will get hands on with real anatomy specimens and learn about how we function. Then they will step into the role of a forensic anthropologist and discover who the missing person is. Finding out what we can tell from skeletal remains!

Computing - CSS Battle! Cascading Style Sheets is the code behind every sleek website and app you've ever used. It's what transforms plain functionality into eye-catching, responsive designs. Learning CSS isn't just a skill, it's the foundation of creative problem-solving in web development. The CSS Battle Challenge is students' chance to put those skills to the test by replicating intricate designs using only CSS. Whether you're new to coding or a seasoned developer, this is a chance to push limits and for students to show what they can create.

Maths - Cryptography plays a vital role in securing online communication. From encrypting messages on apps like WhatsApp to protecting sensitive banking transactions and ensuring national security, mathematical principles underpin the encryption methods that keep our digital lives safe. In this interactive session you will be introduced to some web apps that allow students to explore how encryption works.

Mechanical, Civil and Biomedical Engineering - In this joint Engineering activity, students will explore Mechanical, Civil and Biomedical Engineering with an engaging, practical session.

Biomedical Engineering - Hands-on demos and short, interactive workshops including, ultrasound imaging and measuring heart rate and other vital parameters.

Mechanical Engineering - Race Formula 1-style rocket cars on our custom-built track. It's a fast-paced, competitive activity where student will not only race against each other but also analyse the aerodynamic performance of their designs to see what makes a winning car. Alongside the thrill of racing, students will also take part in a wind turbine challenge, exploring how mechanical design impacts energy generation. This interactive exercise introduces the principles of renewable energy and shows how engineers are tackling real-world challenges in sustainability.



Civil Engineering - Each team will design and build their own structure using a computer simulation, focusing on principles of structural design. Once complete, opposing teams will take turns strategically removing individual components, attempting to bring the structure down. It's a fun and interactive way to learn about engineering, teamwork, and the importance of good design.

Primary and Secondary Education - 'The Pizza Challenge!" Join the Teacher Education team to find out more about Primary and Secondary Teaching. This session will focus on the creative opportunities that can be incorporated into planning engaging, rich learning experiences for the classroom. Students will take part in a Pizza Planning Challenge with a prize of Fallone's part-baked pizzas for the winning plan!

There has been an increase in pupils coming back from lunch quite late for classes in recent weeks.
