Scottish Space School 2025

The Faculty of Engineering at the University of Strathclyde is delighted to be offering the Scottish Space School programme 2025 for school pupils in S5 across Scotland. The programme will run at the University from Monday 9 to Friday 13 June 2025.

There are 100 places available on the week-long programme this year at which attendees will hear from staff at the University of Strathclyde, as well as hearing from some of the world's leading figures in space travel, including NASA Astronauts and engineers. Participants will also take part in a group project which they will present to a selection panel made up of staff from the University and NASA on the final day.

At the end of the programme in June, 8 lucky pupils will be selected to travel to Houston, USA in October 2025 to complete the 'Learning Journey to NASA' trip. There is no cost associated with attending the programme in June, or the trip to Houston in October.

May Immunisations

HPV and MMR Vaccines coming on May 22 May 2025. These are for students in S1 and also offered for S2 to S6 students who have never received the vaccine.

Evidence shows the HPV vaccine helps protect people from HPV-related cancers. The human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine is offered to every S1 pupil in Scotland.

Getting the vaccine now protects you against future risks. HPV can lead to cancers like:

Head and neck cancers Cervical cancer Anogenital cancers – for example, anal, penile (penis) cancer, cancer of the vagina, and cancer of the vulva

A recent study looked at cases of HPV-related cervical cancer in women living in Scotland. It found that there have been no cases in fully vaccinated women who got their first dose of the HPV vaccine at 12-13 years old.

The HPV vaccine also protects you against over 90% of genital wart infections.
